Pastor's Piece

Brothers and Sisters of the Great Plains Conference,

I ask that you join me in prayer that God will share wisdom and mercy with all involved in the war escalating between Israel and Hamas.

As you no doubt have seen in recent days, Hamas made an unusual move by invading Israeli territory from the Gaza Strip in the southern portion of the region. More than 1,200 people have been killed as of this letter, and more people have been kidnapped. Many of those victims have been women and children.

Israel has every right to defend itself, and its government has the responsibility to protect its people. Likewise, Palestinians — Muslim, Christian or otherwise — have for decades been treated as second-class citizens. With harsh restrictions even on basic services such as electricity and water, Palestinians living in Israel have every right to push for equity for their people.

But violence is not the answer. Terrorism is not a negotiating tactic. And bloodshed cannot be condoned.

These barbaric acts have done nothing to further the cause of equity and, in fact, have forced Israel's hand in acting to defend its people.

A conflict that stretches back thousands of years can only be resolved through the love and peace from the Creator of all involved. So please join me in prayer seeking God's intervention in this situation, particularly for God's peace to wash over all involved so that enemies might become friends and that lives could be saved.

May our world experience the blessing shared by the Apostle Paul in 2 Thessalonians 3:16 — "May the Lord of peace himself give you peace always in every way. The Lord be with all of you."

Piercingly honest, the book includes a working reparations project that the women conceived together.
