Pastor's Piece

December 3 is the first Sunday of the season called Advent in the church calendar. While the regular calendar's new year begins on January 1, the church year begins with Advent. Advent usually begins on the last Sunday of November or the first week of December, but this year it falls on December 3, the first Sunday of December.

For those of us new to church, I would like to share with you the meaning of Advent. Advent has two major meanings. One is to wait for the birth of our Savior Jesus, who came to this earth as a young baby to save us and prepare to welcome Him. And the other is to prepare our hearts as we wait for the second coming of Jesus Christ, who will return as the Lord of judgment on this earth.

If you look at church history, the four Sundays before Christmas have been observed as Advent since the early church. It means that it is a period of preparation and waiting for the advent, or descent, of Jesus, the only begotten Son of God, into the world. Advent means that Jesus, the Son of God, came to this earth as a human being, just like making a touchdown with the ball in a football game.

With that meaning in mind, we light candles during Advent. We light five candles in total: three purple, one pink, and one white. The first candle represents the candle of hope, the second represents the candle of peace, the third represents the candle of joy, and the fourth represents the candle of love. White candles are lit on Christmas Day and are called 'Christ candles' because they symbolize Jesus, the light that brightens the world. We light candles every week from Advent to Christmas, waiting for Jesus to come as light to give life to humanity living in darkness.

Every time we light a candle during the Advent Sunday service, we should think of Jesus Christ, who came as light, as we look at the burning candle, and use it as a time to pledge to the hope, peace, joy, and love that are given through Him. Above all, we must not forget that Advent is not simply a time to remember the birth of Jesus, who came to this earth 2,000 years ago, but also a time to reflect on our lives and prepare while waiting with the same heart for the second coming of Jesus Christ.

People are busy shopping and partying during Christmas, but we want to use this as a time to eagerly await the birth and second coming of our Savior Jesus Christ.
