#### Pastor's Piece

We are in Thanksgiving season and it's a season we remember all the blessings that we have in our life and give thanks to God for those blessings. We are so thankful to God because God values us. God values us more than anything in the world. King David once praised God saying, "Who are human beings that you are mindful of them and you care for them: Yet you have made them a little lower than God, and crowned them with glory and honor. You have given them dominion over the works of your hands; you have put all things under their feet, all sheep and oxen, and also the beasts of the field, the birds of the air, and the fish of the sea, whatever passes along the paths of the seas."
