Pastor's Piece

We just finished a sermon series "Songs of Christmas." If you think about it, the season of Christmas is a season for songs and praises. It's a time in which we make music to the Lord. Wonderful music about Christ's birth, wonderful music about hope that he brings to us through his salvation. It's a day in which we praise him with music and songs, poems, and so on.

I remember when I first came to America. It was a cold winter around Christmas time and, one night I laid down on my bed felt lonely, had homesickness, had culture shock, and on top of that I was struggling to learn English. And all of sudden, I heard Christmas carolers. A group of people were singing Christmas music. I remember lying down on my bed with heavy heart, but their music Christmas carols began to touch my heart, to minister to me, and my struggle. My loneliness slowly turned into joy as I was listening to the carols, and I sang with them in my heart, "Joy to the world the Lord is come let earth receive her king..."

Christmas is a season for songs and music. But what if we're going through a hard time? In this world we make music, we celebrate our life through music when things are going well. Music is for festive occasions. But when you are really down and out, can you sing? There is a difference between a worldly concept of music and what we call praise. Because praise is for all time, especially when you're going through hard times. Because praise has power to lift you up. Praise has a way of touching your heart. So as we celebrate this season, which is a season for praise and music, I want to invite you today to give praise to him even in hard times.

Luke chapter 2, one of the most popular most famous stories of the nativity scene, is where the shepherds were outside in the field. And during that time being outside in the field meant you have no place to sleep, your place of rest was with the animals. But to them the good news of Christ's birth comes, and the heavens open up, the angels appear, and angels sing, "Glory to God in heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors." Beautiful singing and music goes on in heavenly places. Then they hear the message that the Savior is born today. So they are directed to the place

in a manger where the Savior is born, and upon seeing the infant Christ, they break out in songs and praise. So even in this most popular, the most native scene, it is filled with songs and praises from beginning to end. This season is all about singing, making music to the Lord, praising is good news.

Friends, I want to invite you to praise Him even in hard times.










The Nativity
