Pastor's Piece

The 24th Winter Olympics will begin this Friday in Beijing, China. For the next two weeks I will enjoy watching the Olympic games. I am always fascinated by the opening ceremony, hundreds of performers showing a wonderful celebration of the country's history and culture.

Did you know that there are about 15 sports in Beijing Winter Olympics? They are bobsled, luge, skeleton, ice hockey, figure skating, speed skating, short track speed skating, curling, alpine skiing, freestyle skiing, snowboarding, biathlon, cross-country skiing, ski jumping and Nordic combined. What is your favorite sport? Probably we are excited to watch any games the US will play.

My favorite winter sport is short track speed skating which is one of Korea's most popular sports. South Korea won a total 17 medals and most of the medals actually came from this short track speed skating. The Women's 3,000m relay will be very exciting to watch because it's not just one player but all three players having to work together in harmony. They must have the right strategy when to slow down, to pick up speed and to pass other skaters and on the last few laps they must be the fastest skater around the track. If one player makes a mistake, the whole team loses. Those three athletes fascinate people and they show how to work together as a team. As I think about the race two scriptures came to my mind.

First, the scripture reminds us that we are running the race. 1 Corinthians 9:24-25 says, "Do you not know that in a race all the runners run, but only one gets the prize? Run in such a way as to get the prize. Everyone who compete in the games goes into strict training. They do it to get a crown that will not last; but we do it to get a crown that will last forever." God has given us a race to run, the race of living a Christian Life. We are to run or live life in a way that we will win the Crown or eternal life. Second, God calls us unity. Jesus says, "I in them and you in me, that they may become perfectly one, so that the world may know that you sent me and loved them even as you loved me" (John 17:23). Jesus wants us to be unified so that the world will know that He is God's Son and that He loves them.

The good news is we are not alone in this race. We are in God's team and our head coach God trains, guides us, gives us direction. Not only that we have other Christian brothers and sisters who are also running the race with us. Let us help each other and keep encouraging each other until we finish the race here on earth!

Scripture Reading: 1 Corinthians 13

A wise physician said, "The best medicine for humans is love." Someone asked, "What if it doesn't work?" The doctor said, "Increase the dose!"—Anon.



The Bible reading for today is from the apostle Paul's first letter to the church in Corinth. Chapter 13 is arguably the most well-known 13 verses in the New Testament. This chapter is often called the "Love Chapter" because the theme is love.

However, the "love" of this chapter is not the love popularized by American popular culture. *This* love is known as *agape* love, using the Greek word itself as the name for this love. As you may already know, this love is the highest, noblest and most sacrificial love of all.

13 things you may not know about agape love

- 1. It's more important to have love than to have faith, v. 1.
- 2. It's more important to give love than to give away all your possessions, v. 3.
- 3. Love is patient, that is, it is not ill-mannered toward others, vv. 4-5.
- 4. Love is kind, v. 4.
- 5. Love is not stubborn and resentful, and certainly is not happy when others experience bad luck, vv. 4-6.
- 6. Love is happy when truth is out, v. 6.
- 7. Love can put up with a ton of stuff, v. 7.
- 8. Love is so trusting as to be considered naïve, v. 7.
- 9. Against all odds, love never loses hope, v. 7.
- 10. Love perseveres no matter what life throws at it, v. 7.
- 11. This most rare kind of love never ends, v. 8.
- 12. Try to think of everything most sacred, most holy, most admired ³/₄ love is greater, vv. 8-13.
- 13. Of the list of virtues faith, hope and love, for example love comes in first, v. 13. —Timothy Merrill

Prayer: Lord Jesus, fill me, just an imperfect vessel, with your love. Fill me to overflowing, so that your love may wash over all those I meet today, this week and every day thereafter. In your name. Amen.


