

Elsa must make an agonizing choice: fight for the land she loves or leave it behind and go west in search of a better life for her family. *The Four Winds* is a rich, sweeping novel that stunningly brings to life the Great Depression and the people who lived through it—the harsh realities that divided us as a nation and the enduring battle between the haves and have-nots. 
UMCOR – Relief for Turkey and Syria – As many of you have heard in news reports, a powerful 6.3 aftershock struck Turkey's Hatay province, near the Syrian border, on Monday, February 20. This was an aftershock to the deadly 7.8 magnitude earthquake from February 6 that killed more than 46,000 in Turkey and Syria. UMCOR reports that 4.1 million people are dependent on UMCOR and other sources of humanitarian aid, and the need is immediate. If you feel so led, you can write a check to First United Methodist Church Valley Center and write UMCOR Advance #982450 on the memo line. We will collect funds throughout March and mail a check at the end of the month.

The Insight Class will begin their Lenten Study, He Chose the Nails by Max Lucado, on Sunday,




**February 26**. This class meets in the Conference Room on Sunday mornings at 10:00 a.m. and is led by June Marcy. In this five session Bible study, Max Lucado explores the many gifts that Christ provided to us at His crucifixion. These include not only the gift of the cross but also the gift of the thorns that pierce His brow. The nails that tore His flesh. The seamless robe that he removed for us. The empty tomb where He forever

defeated sin and death. As we unwrap these gifts, we need to pause and listen for His voice. As we do, perhaps we will hearHim whisper, "I did it just for you."

The Grace of Les Misérables – The Progressive Class will begin their Lenten Study on Monday, February 27 at 7:00 p.m. in the Fireside Room. Victor Hugo's Les Misérables is a truly epic story. Whether you've tackled the 1,400-page 19<sup>th</sup> century novel, witnessed the Broadway musical (and memorized its soundtrack), or seen the several screen adaptations of it, you already know the power of its story. In the six-week study The Grace of Les Misérables, author and pastor Matt Rawle dives into six ideals



found in the story—grace, justice, poverty, revolution, love, and hope—each represented by a character in Hugo's story. As these imperfect and relatable characters interact, we can see how these ideals work together (perhaps even in spite of each other) out in the world. In keeping with his previous works, Matt Rawle brings us to the intersection of Church and Pop Culture by drawing parallels between the iconic story and musical and our Christian calling, inspiring us to both understand our faith and live it out in the world. *The cost of the book is \$6.00*.



Join us for "Tea and Lenten Study" We will enjoy tea with Pastor Ji and study Max Lucado's book "In the Footsteps of the Savior." With beautiful photographs and thoughtful questions for reflection, you will feel like you are walking in the footsteps of Jesus. Max Lucado will take you on a tour of the Holy Land, through places like Bethlehem, Nazareth, Galilee, the Jordan River, Bethany, Jerusalem, and more. As you see the places Jesus walked from a new perspective, you'll also

deepen your connection with the King of the universe who became the Savior on the cross. Pastor Ji will lead this study on Wednesday afternoons beginning March 1 at 2:00 p.m. in the Fireside Room.
