#### Pastor's Piece

Today is the last Wednesday in March. As we know Kansas weather is unpredictable, but the sun is warm, and it is going to be a beautiful spring. A lot of new grasses have turned to green in the yard and flowers have come up and will bloom soon. A few days ago, I saw three cardinals playing in our back yard. Yes, I feel the spring.

Nevertheless, the world is in turmoil due to the pandemic and wars. The COVID-19 pandemic is not over yet, but Russia invaded Ukraine about a month ago, killing tens of thousands of people including civilians and little children. I got to read a story about a father, William Hubbard of Pittsburgh, Massachusetts, U.S. who entered the battlefield in Ukraine to help his 19-year-old daughter and 8-month-old grandson escape.

His daughter was attending the Kyiv Dance University in Ukraine. Last year, a grandson was also born. William tried to bring his daughter and grandson back to the States, but due to COVID-19, he was unable to obtain a birth certificate and passport for his grandson who was born in a house other than a hospital. War broke out while William, who returned to the United States, was trying to solve the problem.

The father worried about them, so he boarded a plane in early March to enter Ukraine again. Then he arrived in Warsaw via Istanbul. From there, he crossed the border on foot and took a car or train to get to where her daughter was. The distance he traveled was almost 5,000 miles. After passing through such adversity and moving in a procession of refugees, they arrived at the border between Ukraine and Slovakia on the 11th. That's how he led his daughter and grandson to a safe place. He said, "Any father would do it like me." They remain there as they await official documentation and governmental approval from the U.S. and Ukraine to cross to safety.

After running and taking great risks, we would have been able to laugh together in the end.

As I read the story of Hubbard, I questioned myself, "Can I make such sacrifice for my loved one?" I know I will do whatever I can do to rescue them, but it may not be that easy. The story makes me think of the terrible sacrifices Jesus Christ made to rescue me. The more I think of it, the deeper and greater I am touched by his sacrifice and love. As we continue on this Lenten journey, I invite you to reflect on the sacrifice Jesus Christ made for us on the cross and think also about who would be my daughter and grandson around us so that we would go and rescue them.

Today we join in hands in prayer to weep together and pray for their peace.
