Pastor's Piece

The Lenten journey is almost coming to an end. As we go through 'Holy Week,' we remember Jesus who suffered and died on the cross for us and deeply understand the heart of God for humanity. At the end of this week, we will finally celebrate Easter. I can picture that all churches and all believers will celebrate and share the joy of Jesus' resurrection with the world.

When Lent ends and Easter comes, we celebrate the resurrection of the Lord and the new hope contained in it. The atmosphere of worship becomes brighter to give thanks. We sing the Psalms of Glory and 'Hallelujah' that could not be sung during Lent. We can sing powerfully, dance, and shout "Hallelujah."

A common custom related to Easter is handing out eggs. Do you know why we are handing out eggs? There are many stories about it. Eggs represent new life and rebirth, and it's thought that this ancient custom became a part of Easter celebrations. In the medieval period, eating eggs was forbidden during Lent so on Easter Sunday, tucking into an egg was a real treat. It is difficult to know exactly where they originated but just preparing and sharing eggs seems that we were trying to share our joy and gratitude more abundantly.

In addition to this, Easter scenes vary in each country. In the United States, there is a parade at Easter. We provide easter egg hunts for children. In Italy children are given chocolate, adults are given 'Colomba Pasquale,' a pigeon-shaped bread on Easter. It is said that there is a tradition of family and friends enjoying a picnic the next day. In Eastern Europe, such as Hungary, Easter is celebrated because of the popular belief that being struck by water will drive away ghosts, purify your mind, and make you more likely to have children. It is also said that there is a custom in the morning where men fill buckets full of water and pour water on women.

Easter is celebrated in various ways in all countries and cultures to express joy and gratitude.

I realize that it is a time of sharing and celebration. In what ways have you spent time with your family and friends? Have you been celebrating the Resurrection? What is the First United Methodist Church's tradition of sharing the joy and gratitude of resurrection? I hope this Easter 2024 you create a new

tradition for your families to share the joy and the gratitude of the resurrection. I look forward to it. The Lord is Risen! Happy Easter!


